Grand Council Flag of the  
Mi'kmaq Nation



- The flag's colours and symbols each have distinct meanings:
  - **Wapék (White)** – Denotes the purity of Creation
  - **Mekwék Klujjewey (Red Cross)** – Represents mankind and infinity (four directions)
  - **Nákúset (Red Sun)** – Represents forces of the day
  - **Tepkunaset (Red Moon)** – Represents forces of the night

The flag is meant to be hung vertically but it is commonly flown horizontally with the star in the upper left corner
